Election of Board of Director Officers: The Board of Directors meeting was called to order by President Joe Murray. Alex nominated the current board members to be elected again for 2017: President: Joe Murray, Vice President: Alex Stevens, Secretary: Sande Balch, Acting Treasurer: Sande Balch. Approved. (Alex/Ali).

Agenda/Minutes: The agenda was approved with the following additions of OPTC brochure mailings, Bike map, Fun Days. The minutes of the November 21, 2016 meeting were approved. (Alex/Michelle).

Financial Reports: Sande presented the 4th quarter 2016 financial report as well as the 2016 annual financial summary. Balances at the end of 2016 were \$13,442.22 in checking and \$1,053.89 in the CD. January records showed membership deposits totaling \$625 and checks written for NSBF membership/\$150, Clallam Bay/Seki Chamber membership/\$75, Clallam Bay Visitor Center/\$600. Report ... Grant FY 2008 (web site/kiosks) ... Michelle:

The kiosk panels have been finalized, are ready to print and should be installed this spring.

Report ... Grant FY 2011 (Elwha Interpretive Center) ... Michelle:

The grant is closed, but still waiting for a financial report/summary from Clallam County so the grant record book can be completed and filed.

Ali mentioned that Ray's Grocery has sold and she will contact the new owner for membership and will also contact Mason's.

It was also brought to our attention that the Salt Creek has opened again. Sande will contact.

Membership Business Directory ... Sande:

Sande questioned if we are putting the business directory to good use for the cost of printing. Michelle said that there are only about 375 directories remaining. Port Angeles and Sequim visitor centers each use about 200-250 per year. Clallam Bay Visitor Center, Depot Museum, Sunsets Co-op hand them out to travelers. Michelle puts a few in each of the brochure mailings throughout the year. Ali suggested that she could take them to OPTC meetings to hand out as needed/requested. It was agreed that there is a need for the printed brochure, so Sande will continue to update and get the process moving for the 2017 edition.

Report ... LTAC committee update on grant applications ... Sande:

Sande reported that the new LTAC bylaws are not online, but if anyone would like a copy it can be emailed. The funding application/guidelines is online. This committee needs two more members: one collector of the lodging tax and one a potential spender/recipient of the funds.

Report ... Clallam Bay Lighthouse project update ... Ali

There was nothing new to report.

Clallam Bay/Seki Fun Days ... Ali

A "Music in the Park" event is planned for the festival this year. Ali asked if the Association would be able to support the expanded program in some way. She will come back with more specific information at the next meeting.

Report ... Visitor Information ~ Forestry App project ... Joe

Joe shared a preliminary draft of the information that might be available on the app. He will email a copy to us to look at more closely and make comments.

Discussion ... Deer Park Storage ... Sande

The rent for storage will increase in May from \$54.50 to \$57.50 per month. Insurance is required at \$8.00 per month if the renter does not have proof of insurance. The rent is due on March 17th ... 3 months with insurance is \$190.50 and 6 months with insurance is \$387.00. There was some discussion concerning the cost of storage and other options. It was approved to pay for the six months while we explore other options for storage.

Discussion ... Great Strait Sale ... 10-year birthday party ... Ali and Sande

This will be the 10th year of the Great Strait Sale. A suggestion was to present music at each of the three community sites and come up with a marketable "birthday party" theme to attract sellers and buyers. We will continue to think this through before the summer promotion of the sale begins. Sande also noted that someone else needs to take over the Joyce Site Supervisor role as the physical job is more than she can accomplish anymore. She suggested that Michelle, Margaret and perhaps Alex are all at the event and asked if they would think about taking this on.

Sande is willing to continue doing the media, promotion, and flyer ads for the event.

Discussion ... Planning for the Future of JFSBA ... Some time (perhaps a separate dedicated meeting) needs to be spent discussing future goals, emphases, and a means to support any projects.

Discussion ... Meeting Schedule ... All meetings through June will be held in the Joyce area ... Family Kitchen, Blackberry Café, Elwha Dam RV, (Salt Creek?) ... at 3:pm. The dates will be March 28, April 25, May 23, June 27.

OPTC brochure mailing to VIC ... Michelle ... It was approved to participate in this mailing at a cost of \$110 and 230 pieces to mail. (Alex/Margaret) It was also approved to allow up to \$200 for postage for Michelle to respond to further requests for brochures. (Alex/Margaret)

Ali will check on the cost and process for mailing our brochures out to consumer requests through the OPVB (perhaps just for a prime month of planning ... April ... rather than all year).

Biking map ... Michelle

Michelle received an inquiry as to our possible participation in supporting the cost of printing an Olympic Bike Trail map again. Michelle will check to see if the map is the east or west side of the county. We will discuss this at a future meeting.

Hwy 101 road work ... Lake Crescent ...

Sande noted that a list of scheduled road work was in the Forks Forum, several locations in addition to the Hwy 101 Lake Crescent work. The Lodging Tax (LTAC) group is holding some money back in case there is need of some major media work to help the traveling public. The OPVB is prepared to work with all partners to send a strong message of welcome and how to get through/around all the road work.

It was suggested that perhaps there should be a prize for any traveler who actually finds his/her destination/manages to arrive!

Biking Map ... The Peninsula Trails Coalition applied for \$2000 in funding for an update and printing of the "Eastern Clallam County" biking map. The budget for the project is \$5900. PTC has received \$4000 from a OPVB Tourism Enhancement Grant. It was agreed to fund \$500 for the project with the following requests: Change the title from Eastern to Central Clallam County, include the Lyre River Land Trust on the map, provide copies of the map to the scenic byway distribution points: Clallam Bay Visitor Center and Depot Museum. Approved (Alex/Ali)

Report ... Membership Directory ... Sande

The directory has been printed (\$200 Laurel Black for updates and \$601.62 Olympic Printers for printing quantity of 2000) and delivered.

Report ... Deer Park Storage ... Sande

The Board authorized payment of six months' storage rent. Three months have been paid (due again June 17th) hoping to have stored items moved to the Clallam Bay Visitor Center and a system in place for access before June 17th. We have to give Deer Park at least 10 days notice to vacate. If we need to stay longer, we will pay by the month as rent is not refundable.

Report ... Duck Derby ... Sande

Duck Derby Sales are April 21 through May 20 ... the race is Sunday May 21st. Sande will sell at Safeway and Alex will sell at Joyce General.

Report ... Lodging Tax Committee/LTAC ... Sande

LTAC recommended a payment of \$105,000 from LTAC funds to Clallam County for an Olympic Discovery Trail single bridge/abutments off Hwy 112 segment that will connect to Lake Crescent.

International PowWow ... Sande

We have the opportunity to participate in the marketing by Washington Tourism Alliance at the International PowWow again this year. Our brochure and two photos can be added to the thumb drive they distribute to international tour interests. They will give us the membership rate (based on OPVB membership ... and because we are a non-profit) of \$75. Approved (Ali/Alex).

Fun Days ... Ali

Ali updated us on the plans for the music festival for Fun Days. The budget is \$12,000 to get the event established. Ali is working on getting partners (perhaps paid ads on program, First Federal community grant, OPVB grant, Chito Beach and Brian's Photo donations). Ali requested \$500 from our organization. Approved (Alex/Margaret).

Great Strait Sale ... Ali

Ali has a Bluegrass group for music at the Clallam Bay site. She is also certain that the Lion's Club would offer hot dogs and hamburgers for sale. Sande will work on music for the Joyce location and contact Neah Bay to see if they can offer music as well.

OPVB direct request mailings ... Michelle

800 brochures have been delivered to date by the OPVB direct mailing process. Michelle will deliver another 800 brochures. Michelle has mailed 200 brochures total to six different visitor information centers in Washington.

National Scenic Byway Foundation Webinar info ... Sande:

A webinar was held in March ... "Social Impact Investing." This concerned foundations investing funds from endowments in projects that create social or environmental impact while still generating a modest financial return ... methods such as low interest loans or low rent on property owned by the foundation. Foundations give \$54 billion each year of \$480 billion available. Traditionally, of funds available, 5% is given in grants and the rest is invested in the stock markets. 94% of non-profits have never pursued funding from foundations outside of grants.

A webinar was held in April ... "Is your byway organization ready to ask for money?"

Great Strait Sale ... Sande

It was agreed that the date of September 9th works for the 10th Annual Great Strait Sale. Calls are being received two from Oregon and one from Canada concerning the sale. The poster on the web site has been updated and Sande will begin posting the event to online calendars.

Fall Meeting Dates ... Sande

The fall meeting schedule will be Sept 25th, October 23rd, November 20th ... all at 3pm and all at east end locations. Sande will work on meeting sites closer to the time of each meeting.

Joe thought it would be interesting to schedule a tree farm tour for our group at Pysht. He will work on a date/time and contact us to see who can attend.

Deer Park Storage ... Sande

Sande and Michelle went through all the materials at the storage unit. Sande will sort the file papers for storing/sharing/discarding. Michelle will remove the brochure/directory/booklet stock and the shelf units this week and vacate the storage unit. A refund for unused rental days and the damage deposit will be refunded. The storage will now be set up at the Clallam Bay VIC

which is the Association's official address.

Fun Days ... Music in the Park ... Ali ... They have found a less expensive insurance and found other ways to cut costs to put on the event.

Clallam Bay Lighthouse Project ... Ali ... The Lion's Club has some money to put into this now.

Forestry App Project/Visitor Information ... Joe ... Joe would like to have comments on the rough draft/working paper for this project. He will send the information out again via email. He would invite the board to think about interesting ideas in the forest (Hwys 112/113) that could be included in the forest app. Ali would like to be able to link into this at the Clallam Bay VIC (along with the hydrophone and with internet and a big screen tv available for viewing).

Timber Museum in Duncan, British Columbia ... Joe ... Joe was quite impressed with the museum in Duncan. It had lots of displays, updated interactive displays, a virtual reality drive through the woods in side. It also included railroad displays, inside/outside tool displays and outside equipment displays on the grounds which total 100 acres.

FY2008 Grant (interpretive kiosks) ... Michelle ... Michelle said the files for the two Freshwater Bay panels is at the printers (who are very busy this time of year).

FY2011 Grant (Elwha booklet) ... Michelle ... Michelle informed us that the NPCA who granted money for a second printing of the Elwha booklet are anxious for that to happen as their logo will be included in the next printing. The \$3000 grant was to pay for 2500 copies of the booklet. Since then the printing prices have gone up to about \$3390 plus tax. There would also be charges of about \$200 to update the logo and make map changes for the second printing. It was approved to print 2500 copies and pay the cost overage for printing and the cost of graphic updates if the NPCA is not willing to pay that difference. The NPCA would like to have a digital copy as well. Michelle can contact the board via email if any problems/questions should arise. (George/Ali ... Joe recused).

Map update/some laminated ... Michelle ... Michelle requested funds to update the map and travel itineraries on the web site. It was approved to spend up to \$350 to complete this update and laminate copies of the map. (George/Alex ... Joe recused)

Bike Map ... Michelle ... Michelle received communication from the Trails Coalition. They are receptive to our requests to add the Lyre River Conservation Area to the map. They will deliver 70 maps to our group for the Joyce Depot Museum and the Clallam Bay Visitor Center. They will not change the name on the map because the "Western Clallam County" map is in process. They will consider adding a "coming soon" to the map front where the inset has mention of the Jefferson County map.

Lyre River Land Trust ... Michelle ... This group is seeking a future ambassador for the area ... a consultant to strategize what is needed to showcase the Lyre River. There were some interesting ideas in the proposal. Perhaps something similar could be done for the Elwha. Michelle will email a copy to the board members to read.

Great Strait Sale ... Sande

Sande presented a written report for the 2017 (10th anniversary) Great Strait Sale. Income was \$373.44 from ads and donated goods for sale. Expenses totaled \$181.27 for printing costs and news ads. Although this special sale date had the first rain of the ten year run, the spirit of the buyers wasn't lessened ... but the number of sellers was down substantially. The give-away birthday cake in Joyce and the music celebration in Clallam Bay were very popular.

By Written Report from Michelle Little ...

Elwha Interpretive Booklet ... The second printing of the booklet has been completed at a cost of \$437.50 for design updates (association paid this) and \$3725.33 for printing 2,500 copies (the National Park Conservation Association paid \$3500, the remainder paid by the association). A pdf copy is available on the web site. The NPCA received 3 boxes of the new print for their own distribution.

Map and Website (highway112.com) Updates ... The homepage map online and general website pages have been updated. A printable map with points of interest was updated and added to the website in a printer-friendly format.

Comment: Slanting the type for locations on the coast might place it closer to the actual site.

Trip Itineraries ... Itineraries for History and Culture, Recreation, and Photography and Wildlife are completed. The last itinerary is the Working Forest and is in draft form.

Comments: ** There were several comments/questions about the content of the History and Culture itinerary text. This should be studied prior to and then discussed at a meeting.

Pillar Point Kiosk ... A work order for installation of these panels has been submitted.

Tiles ... There are 10 tiles paid for, but not painted yet from May last year. The Elwha Klallam Tribe may be interested in painting and/or buying more tiles for the school kids. Sande is interested in purchasing a full panel (16 tiles) in memory of Herb Balch. Michelle has offered to lead/do the installation.

Comments: ** Think about selling tiles at the Great Strait Sale ** Keep emphasis of memorial or honorarium on nature artwork of the area rather than words about a specific person ... using the cover of the kids activity booklet for memory of Herb would show the coastal area/similar to the association logo. Make wording very simple. This partly to set a precedent for future requests.

Brochure Distribution ... Michelle provided distribution numbers for brochures, directories, Elwha booklets and kids' activity booklets for the period April 1- August 1, 2017.

Elwha River Interpretive Center – Entrance Sign ... Wendy Sampson of the Elwha Klallam Tribe has been using the Interpretive Center often this summer and suggested it would be helpful to have an entrance sign. We may be able to apply for a grant from the tribe for a sign. Michelle also mentioned that a new broom is stored behind the Port a Potty. It would be helpful to have someone(s) volunteer to do monthly litter clean-up at the site.

Comments: ** Ok to pursue the idea of a grant for an entrance sign if the Elwha tribe is interested ** Check the idea out with Clallam County Roads first ** The Joyce area board members at least would be willing to work on a "litter patrol" on a revolving basis ** How about having a public event at the interpretive center next spring and/or on some regular basis

Storage ... All supplies and storage shelving units have been moved to the Clallam Bay Visitor Center for storage where the "permanent records" for the association are already stored. The CBVIC is the legal physical address for the association. The association pays the Clallam Bay Chamber \$50mo/\$600annually to help defray costs for phone/internet for the center.

Next meeting will be sometime near October 23, dependent on Joe's work schedule, at the east end of the highway.
