Get ready: Hood Canal Bridge closes May 1 for six weeks From Joe Irwin, WSDOT Communications, Hood Canal Bridge Project

The Hood Canal Bridge will close to traffic for six weeks starting May 1 so the Washington State Department of Transportation can replace the entire east half along with the east and west trusses. The Olympic Peninsula will still be open for business. WSDOT encourages people to get ready now by reviewing their transportation options to determine the best route. "Get around" options include:

- A fare-free passenger-only water shuttle between Jefferson and Kitsap counties
- A Sunday through Thursday reservation-based car ferry between Port Townsend and Edmonds
- A free, reservation-based medical bus service
- Driving around on US 101 and SR 3
- Ridesharing

From Bill Riley, WSDOT Maintenance Superintendent at Port Angeles

A one-lane dirt/gravel road will be constructed in the next month or so at milepost 37 to once again establish through traffic on Highway 112. The amount of time to complete the project will be dependent on cooperative weather for road work, assuming that no further damage takes place. A more permanent uphill bypass route is being considered for this section of road if and when funding approval and property use/purchase fall into place.

On the Strait and Narrow ...

Blake

According to Don Heikkila, new Area 3 Maintenance Superintendent, the SR112 Safety Improvement Project is close to completion. "Part of the project is the installation of the HARS (Highway Advisory Radio System) and RWIS (Road Weather Information System) at the Burnt Mountain junction which will be completed later this fall. The HARS is capable of providing a radio message for emergency closures and highway conditions when activated by our TMC (Traffic Management Center). The RWIS with it's sensors will provide information on road and weather conditions to support our winter operations."

The other ongoing project has been the realignment above the slide area at mp 37 which is now paved and ready for two-way traffic once again.

Don cautions drivers to be aware of the road hazards caused by seasonal weather. "Fall is here and weather conditions are changing. WSDOT is ready for wind, flooding and snow/ice events as we enter the storm season. During the winter months, WSDOT crews will be using salt and anticing products. No one can guarantee ice and snow-free roadways, so motorists must always be cautious when driving in the wet and cold weather. If you find yourself behind a snowplow truck, allow some distance, use caution when passing. The road <u>behind</u> the snowplow will be safer to drive on. Drive safely."

What's Happening? ... Elwha River Bridge dedication

"On September 25th, 2009, over 200 people attended the Grand Opening of the new Elwha River Bridge. The ceremony took place on the pedestrian bridge approach which is suspended under the vehicle bridge and will eventually become a link to the Olympic Discovery Trail coming west from Port Angeles. County Commissioners Mike Doherty, Steve Tharinger and Mike Chapman attended the ceremony and cut the ribbon with State Representative Lynn Kessler and other event attendees. It was a beautiful, sunny day and, in addition to listening to a number of guest speakers, those who attended were treated to a vehicle parade consisting of older restored log trucks, military vehicles and cars crossing in one direction and other modern vehicles coming the other way including a Crescent School bus loaded with cheerleaders. John Singhose, long-time resident who lives along Highway 112, organized the parade. Besides the great views from the vehicle bridge, the pedestrian bridge provides views of the salmon swimming upstream to spawn. This bridge will become a great side tour opportunity for those who come to the area to visit the Strait of Juan de Fuca Hwy 112 National Scenic Byway. Once the trail portions are completed to the new bridge from Port Angeles, it will be a recreational trail destination as well."
