On the Strait and Narrow ...

According to Jim Skinner, Project Inspector, the WSDOT project to replace the Jim Creek Culvert, which has closed SR112 at milepost 32 since September 7th, is on schedule. The culvert pieces have been set, backfilling done with paving, striping, guardrails yet to complete. The road should be open for at least one lane traffic by October 11th. The detour has been a nice excuse to drive around Lake Crescent for a few weeks. Thank you to those who have supported the local businesses during the road closure. Slide damage to the roadway near SR112 milepost 0 is undergoing repairs. Work began September 27th and is anticipated to last about 23 work days. The road will not be closed, but flaggers will be present. Further east, the Hood Canal Bridge project is underway.
