On the Strait and Narrow ...

Be sure to thank our many road and emergency service people for their efforts to keep our travel paths safe for all of us. The work continues still to clean up from the storm last fall. Belated as this posting may be, the scenic byway community offers its condolences to the families of WSDOT personnel Neal Richards who died November 2009 as he was clearing storm debris and Don Heikkila who died December 2009 of an illness.

Adventure Route Partial Closure ... The lower section of the Olympic Discovery Trail Adventure Route segment is closed from SR112 to Eden Valley until as late as July this year. Active logging of a DNR timber sale in this area makes it unsafe for all users to be in this section. The upper trail can still be used via the Joyce Piedmont access. Parking is available at Crescent School in the south end of the parking lot beside the PA-J-1000 road.

Adventure Route Brochure ... The new Olympic Discovery Trail Adventure Route map/ brochure has been printed and is available through visitor centers and businesses. This was a cooperative project between the Juan de Fuca Scenic Byway Association using a National Scenic Byway Grant, the Olympic Peninsula Visitor Bureau, and Clallam County.

Elwha River Bridge ... The planned temporary closure of the Elwha River Bridge was postponed from the scheduled February date to sometime in the future. The anticipated 21- day closure will allow workers to install a new rail as a safety precaution for bicyclists and pedestrians who cross the canyon on the vehicle deck rather than using the suspended pedestrian path.

Whale Trail ... The Juan de Fuca Scenic Byway Association has been working with the Whale Trail.org group first to recognize sites for land-based whale watching (and for other sea mammals) along Highway 112 and then to produce and print a brochure to raise awareness of these efforts. Watch for other Whale Trail projects to come in the future.

Grant Projects Progress ... This grant will fund a redesign/print of the scenic byway brochure, the development of a scenic byway web site, and the design and installment of interpretive kiosks at the Clallam Bay, Pillar Point, and Freshwater Bay county parks.

Trail Tales...

Olympic Discovery Trail Adventure Route Segment partial closure continues from SR112 to Eden Valley (trail mile markers 0-6). Active logging of a DNR timber sale in this area makes it unsafe for users. Please stay off of the trail until an opening is announced in July or possibly earlier. Logging is also causing unannounced closures from trail mile markers 16-19 between the Joyce Access Road white gate and Joyce Piedmont Road. A new section of trail has officially been opened between trail mile markers 12-15. This new section replaces the 3 miles where you had to follow the Joyce Access road. Get out and enjoy!




