

#### Historical dates ...

### Pysht Tree Farm - 125th Birthday Celebration

The Merrill & Ring families established the company in 1886 with the purchase of the Pysht Tree Farm, which is now the oldest tree farm in Washington State still operated by its original owners. In honor of this great celebration, the following excerpt, written by tree farm manager Joe Murray, gives us a glimpse of how Pysht and eventually Highway 112 evolved since the Merrill and Ring families settled there.

The Juan De Fuca highway was developed in the late 19th Century as a series of trails through the forest connecting logging and fishing communities. Economic transportation was accomplished by water and private timber company railroads. Travel along the dirt trails was primarily for community interaction such as baseball games, dancing, education, and missionary endeavors. Over time the trails evolved from a walking path into a road for wagons, automobiles, and school buses. With different segments having different names like the Clallam Road, the Pysht River Wagon Road, and the New Road (from Pysht to Deep Creek). The segments of roads and trails were consolidated in 1928 as Clallam county road 9A.

The logging camps in 1922 had baseball teams. Sunday games were played through the summer season. Travel along the Juan De Fuca route for the teams required various methods of transportation. A game between the Pysht Camp and the Twin Camp would have required one of the teams and fans to walk the nine miles of trail between the logging camps. A game in Sappho with the Pysht camp would have involved a trip in Merrill & Ring's twelve cylinder Packard, west up the Pysht River Road and south along the Clallam Road to Sappho. A game between the Hoko camp and the Pysht camp could likely involve a ride on a company owned railroad for at least part of the journey.

A journey along the Juan De Fuca highway provides a glimpse of the past as well as a vision of the future, as seen through the working forest.

Currently, a book is in the works telling the story of the last 125 years on the tree farm. Watch for the book release and a celebration (September 28th) at the tree farm this fall.
